Food Safety –

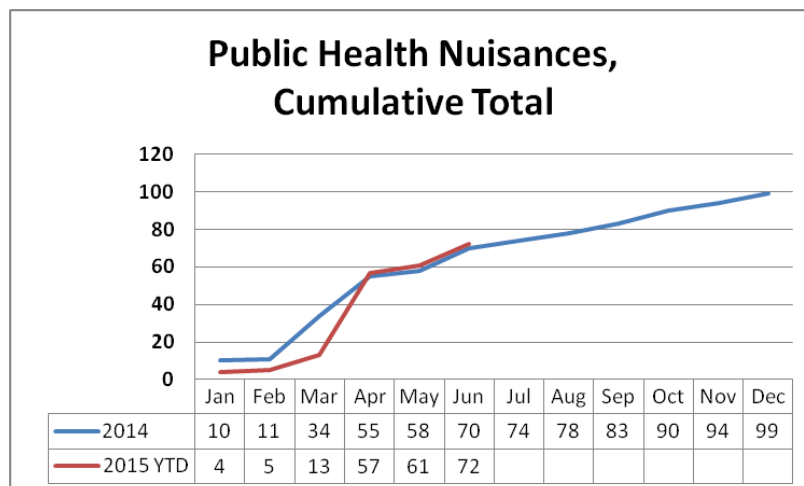
Seasonal food facility inspections are well underway. The former Big Plate Diner, now Chris' Big Plate Diner, was approved to begin operation under new ownership. Club 922 (formerly Shooter's) was licensed in October 2014, but failed to open. The facility had to be re-inspected and the operator was given approval again in June to begin operation. The new inspection website for state mandated programs (food safety & public swimming pools) went live on July 7. This site will streamline the process for making important information available to the public.

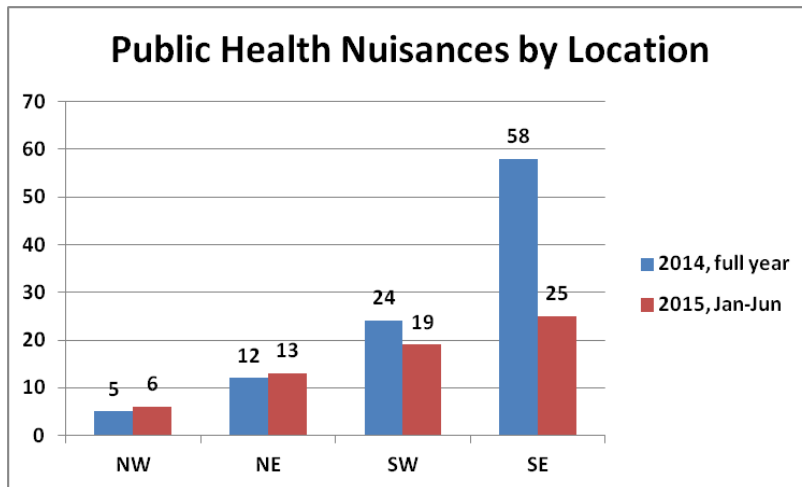
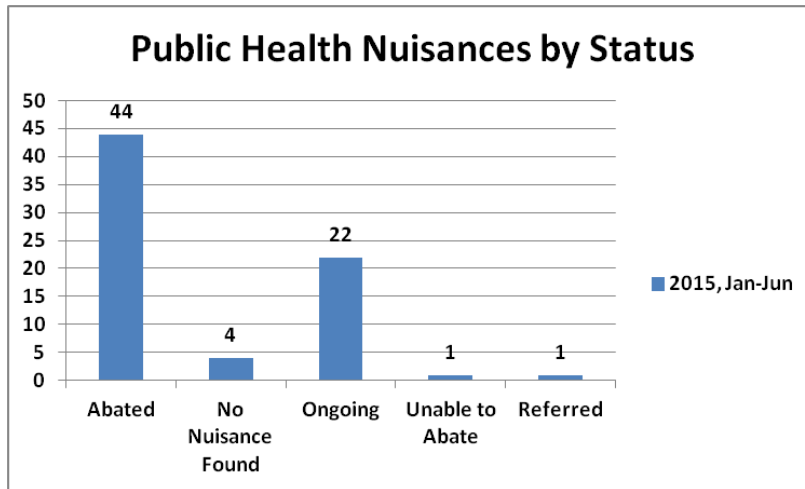
Manufactured Home Parks –

Annual park inspections under the MOU with Ohio Manufactured Homes Commission were completed in June and services billed. Collaborative efforts are ongoing to achieve compliance on a number of fronts in Olentangy Estates, located at 710 Clay Street: condition of the homes, condition of the park, utility accounts in arrears. Public Health Nuisances –

Eleven new public health nuisance cases were reported in June, which represent half of the cases currently ongoing. Two cases are being prosecuted in Crawford County Municipal Court. Trish and I met with Law Director Palmer and Assistant Law Director Keller to improve and begin to standardize the nuisance abatement process.
