

Galion City Board of Health Nursing Division Monthly Report for February 2019

CMH


- Billing was completed and mailed on March 1st for a total of \$370.
- Remittance Advice was received on 2/14 for a total of \$420.
- We are still waiting on billing sent on 11/13/18 with a total of \$1040 yet to be received.

Immunizations

- Three clinics were held during the month of February.
- with a total of 70 appointments and 10 no shows with a no-show rate of 14.29%
- Last February, 52 appointments were scheduled with 13 no-shows with a no-show rate of 25.0%.
- After the initial mass recall we plan to continue recalling children who are due for vaccines including those who decline vaccines at their last visit.
- The mass recall project has completed with 108 recalls sent in February. Moving forward, clients will routinely receive recall postcards as vaccines are due.

Get Vaccinated Ohio - Grant

- An invoice of \$417 was billed to Crawford County on March 1st for reminders and recalls.
- Total of \$3841 has been reimbursement by Crawford County for this grant. A total of \$1383 is has yet to be received.
- School Immunization Educational sessions as required through this grant are to be conducted at the end of school.

Flu

Flu vaccine continues to be recommended. There are currently 30 VFC vaccines and 4 private vaccine for 6 months and up remaining in inventory (as of March 1st).

Lead

- Three lead screenings were conducted in February all with a normal value.
- No new referrals during the month of February.

Foster Screenings

- Two Foster Screenings were conducted in January
- No Foster Screenings were conducted in February

Schools

- Galion City Schools
 - During the month of February letters were prepared to be sent to students entering 7th and 11th grade for required and recommend vaccines.
- St. Joseph School
 - \circ Due to a recent case of lice at this school, a lice check will be conducted for all students on Monday, March 4th.

Training/ Conferences

 On February 27th Emily and Trish attended the 2019 Northeast Ohio Child Passenger Safety Conference. During this conference, 6 CEUs were earned.
