

Galion City Board of Health Nursing Division Monthly Report for September 2021

COVID-19 Contact tracing

- A total of 179 new cases of COVID-19 were reported during the month of September. (as of September 24th)
- 7 reported hospitalizations
- 2 reported deaths

COVID Outbreak Investigations

- There were several new outbreak investigations in the city of Galion opened during the month of September.
- Outbreaks have been investigated in two of the four Long Term Care Facilities in Galion

COVID-19 Vaccine

- Total COVID Vaccines administered during the month of September:80
- Total COVID vaccines administered: 3806
- COVID vaccine is continuing to be offered to homebound individuals as well as in LTCF as needed.
- Vaccines continue to be administered at no cost.

Car Seats

Galion City Schools

- Hearing and vision are completed for Pre-K. We will be screening kindergartners and first graders in October.
- Mobile dental will be coming in November to all 4 buildings. We are receiving quite a few completed forms. This a great service for our students and we are happy to see so many families taking advantage of this opportunity.
- We are continuing to update vaccine records for all the students. Most of the students are up to date.
- o The Galion superintendent mandated masks starting 9/27/2021.
