


# Galion City Board of Health Nursing Division Monthly Report for January 2022



#### COVID-19 Contact tracing

- A total of 577 new cases of COVID-19 were reported during the month of January.
- Letters were sent to all cases during the month of January
- Guidance from ODH has once again changed. The Ohio Department of Health recommends that local
  health departments (LHDs) shift from universal contact tracing, case investigation and exposure
  notification to a cluster- or outbreak-based model. This strategy prioritizes people in high-risk settings,
  such as congregate residential settings (e.g., shelters, correctional facilities, and nursing homes) or for
  certain circumstances such as outbreaks or clusters in specific settings or in relation to initial cases or
  clusters associated with new variants, as appropriate.
- A cluster report of hospitalizations and deaths was received from Avita, raising our deaths to 58 and hospitalizations to 138.

# **COVID Outbreak Investigations**

- Multiple Outbreaks continued throughout the month of January.
- One addition LTCF outbreak has opened for a total of 3 outbreaks in LTCFs in Galion City.
- Several hospital outbreaks continue.

## **COVID-19 Vaccine**

- Total COVID Vaccines administered during the month of January: 39
- Total COVID vaccines administered: 4409
- Total patients immunized with COVID vaccine January 2022: 39
- The state is no longer shipping smaller quantities of pediatric vaccine and therefore has removed the ability for the GCHD to administer the pediatric vaccine. Vaccine orders must contain a minimum order of

100 vaccine. Without the ability to store this vaccine in ultra-cold storage the vaccine shelf life is limited to 10 weeks.

- COVID vaccine is continuing to be offered to homebound individuals as well as in LTCF as needed.
- COVID-19 Vaccines continue to be administered at no cost.
