## **COVID-19 Isolation Letter/Phone Calls**

• A total of seven new cases of COVID-19 were reported.

## **COVID-19 Outbreak Investigations**

• No outbreak Investigations for this month.

## Communicable Disease

• Five Hep C chronic reported cases.

## **COVID-19 Vaccine**

- Six clients received a COVID-19 vaccine one primary dose and five booster doses.
- COVID-19 vaccine is continuing to be offered to homebound individuals as well as in long-term care facilities as needed.
- COVID-19 vaccines continue to be administered at no cost.
- We currently have Novavax for the primary and secondary dose available to the public for free.

# CMH (Children with Medical Handicaps program)

- Currently there are 31 active CMH cases. We are in contact weekly with clients/families for their two months looking ahead for the LOA renewal and Comprehensive PHN Assessment.
- Two office appointments for Comprehension PHN Assessment.

#### Immunizations

- A total of ten children received service from GCHD (20 vaccines given total).
- A total of nineteen adults received service from GCHD (23 vaccines given total).

#### Flu

- Three flu vaccines were given.
- Our walk-in clinic is available each weekday.

• Five head checks were completed for lice.

• No lead screenings were completed in May.
