Updates to COVID, Influenza and RSV reporting

- As of October 1, 2025, only hospitalized COVID, influenza and RSV cases are required to be reported to ODRS and local health departments.

Immunizations

- Six clinics were held in the month of October, as well as walk-ins and same day scheduled appointments.
- A total of 25 children were seen in the immunization clinic, receiving a total of 30 vaccines.
- A total of 157 adults were seen in the immunization clinic, receiving a total of 206 vaccines.
- Of the vaccines administered in October, 151 were flu and 49 were COVID vaccines.
- GCHD will begin to administer the COVID vaccine to patients 12 years and older per ODH.
- Eight locations participated in our flu/COVID outreach clinics in October. St Paul's hosted two well attended clinics and Crestline Library was a new location this year.

TB test administration

- 5-TB skin tests were administered.

Head Checks

- 2-head checks were completed for lice.

Lead

- No lead screenings or investigations were completed in October.

Foster Screenings

- No foster screenings were completed in October.

Car Seat Program

- Five car seat classes were completed with 5 convertible seats being given away and properly installed.
- 0-car seat checks were completed.

St. Joseph School:

- Initial vision and hearing screenings were completed with rescreens being scheduled for December.
- Immunization records were completed and reported to ODH.
